Friday night was the wine-carrying, also known as the African wedding ceremony, which continued until after 1am. The wine-carrying is common-law marriage in Nigeria. Frequently this is the only ceremony the couple goes through. Saturday was the formal Muslim wedding, which started with a religious service that went on from early afternoon until evening, and then the formal reception that MJoTA Publisher and Mr Sulaimon left after dawn on Sunday, after 6am, after giving out copies of a short-lived New York newspaper, which guests at right can be seen reading. The drums had started at midnight, and did not stop until 5am.
